# **Online Safety and Password Study Guide**

### \*Vocabulary:

Anonymous- of unknown name

**Appropriate-** suitable or fitting for a particular purpose, person, and occasion

**Identify-** to recognize as a particular person or thing, to verify the identity of something/someone

Harass- to bother or pressure someone aggressively

Inappropriate- improper, not proper, not okay

Non-identifying- information that is common to many

Online profile- Internet posting of one's characteristics or qualities

**Password-** A password is a combination of letters, numbers, and/or symbols that is used to log you in on a computer, e-mail, social networking sites, etc.

**Personal information-** information that describes a person's identity such as name, date of birth, address, etc

Pitfall- A hidden or unsuspected problem or danger

**Predator-** one who stalks or uses lies or secrecy to get close enough to another person in order to easily hurt or harm him/her

Risky- potentially harmful to one's emotional or physical well-being

Screen name- online nickname or identity

User ID- same as screen name

## **User/Screen Names**

- \*Never use any identifying information in your user name. This includes:
  - 1. Your real first and last name
  - 2. Any part of your address
  - 3. Your location
  - 4. Your telephone number
  - 5. Your e-mail address
  - 6. Inappropriate words
  - 7. Don't combine personal information
  - 8. Gender

<sup>\*\*</sup>Chose a safe screen name, do not reveal information on the Internet, and carefully choose who you communicate with

<sup>\*\*</sup>Always remember, talk to an adult if you ever feel uncomfortable online or are approached by someone who discusses inappropriate things or wants to meet you offline.

### **PASSWORDS**

A password is a combination of letters, numbers, and/or symbols that is used to log you in to a computer, email, social networking sites, etc.

#### DO'S

- a) Should be at least 8 characters or more in length
- b) Include numbers, uppercase letters, lowercase letters, and symbols
- c) A person should use 4-6 different passwords for different uses
- d) Passwords should be changed every 6 months
- e) Only share your password with your parents
- f) Keep passwords in a safe place at home NOT at school or on your computer

#### **DON'T'S**

- a) DON'T use passwords that are easy for people you know (your pet's name, your nickname, school information)
- b) DON'T use any private identity information. Examples include but are not limited to:
  - a. First/last name
  - b. Address/where you live
  - c. Phone numbers
  - d. Mother's maiden name
  - e. Social Security number
  - f. E-mail
  - g. gender
- c) DON'T use a word in the dictionary

#### **2 EASY WAYS TO REMEMBER PASSWORDS**

1. Select a poem, scripture, favorite lyrics, and create a password using the first letter of each word, add numbers and symbols--

Example: Little House on the Prairie LHotP\*104#

2. Something easy for you to remember and change every other letter's case, symbol, or number-

Example: school is cool S~hO\$l~9C\*ol

## **Online Safety**

- 1. Never post your exact date and place of birth.
- 2. Never post your address, phone numbers, or email address.
- 3. Control who can see your personal information and pictures. Use the privacy features. Restrict your page to your real friends, not friends of friends.
- 4. Limit information about your activities-post **after** the fact.
- 5. If you write down your passwords, keep them in a safe place at home, NOT at school.
- 6. Someone met only online should always be considered a stranger.
- 7. Screen names and usernames represent you in Cyberspace. Pick a name that allows you to remain anonymous.
- 8. Most online profiles ask for more information than is needed. Pay attention to the \* symbol. The \* symbol could mean either that information is required or that information is not required. If information is not required, do not fill it in.

#### \*FBI Internet Safety Tips

- 1. Remember to never give out personal information: name, address, school name, or telephone number in a chat room or on bulletin boards.
- 2. Never send a picture of yourself to someone you chat with on the computer without your parents' permission
- 3. Never write to someone who has made you feel uncomfortable or scared
- 4. Do NOT meet someone or have the person visit you without the permission of your parents.
- 5. Tell your parents right away if you read anything on the Internet that makes you feel uncomfortable.
- 6. People online may not be who they say they are. Someone who says that "she" is a "twelve-year-old girl" could really be an older man.

### \*Signs of a Predator

- 1. Pretends to have the same interests, likes, and dislikes as the victim to create an online friendship
- 2. Builds trust by listening to what the victim wants to talk about
- 3. Tells the victim that it is better that he/she does not tell anyone about their friendship
- 4. May threaten to tell the victim's parents or may threaten to hurt his/her family if the victim tells about their friendship. DO NOT ever keep an online friendship secret.
- 5. Goal is to meet face to face alone in real world
- \*\*Any of these steps are inappropriate online behavior- be sure to talk to your parents if this occurs
